

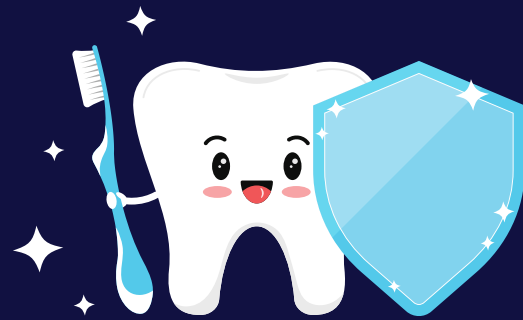
## A PROGRAM FROM THE MINISTÈRE

Each year, the ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux requests that CLSC dental hygienists screen all second-grade students for dental sealant needs.

Once adult molars have erupted and are healthy, students are eligible to receive free dental sealants at school.

The application of dental sealants is recognized as the best practice for cavity prevention.

The dental hygienist can also support schools in implementing a supervised brushing program with fluoride toothpaste for kindergarten students age 4 and 5. Your child's school will inform you of their participation in this program, if applicable.

## A DENTAL CHECK-UP

It's important that your child visits the dentist **at least once a year** for a complete check-up.

### LICE ALSO GO BACK TO SCHOOL!

Here are some preventive measures:

- Keep long hair tied back;
- Place hats, caps and scarves in the coat sleeves;
- Tell your child to avoid touching his or her head to other people's heads;
- Check your children's heads regularly;
- Read *Lice... Lice... Lice...* here. >



## How to brush your teeth properly



Ask Mom and Dad to be with you when you brush your teeth with your fluoride toothpaste.

1. Put a pea-sized amount of fluoridated toothpaste on your toothbrush.
2. Make sure the toothbrush's bristles touch your gums when you brush your teeth.
3. Don't forget to brush your tongue.
4. Spit out your toothpaste, don't rinse your mouth and try not to drink water for 30 minutes.

Tell Mom and Dad it's so that the fluoride toothpaste will continue to protect your teeth.



### GOOD VISION FACILITATES LEARNING AT SCHOOL

We suggest you **see an optometrist** before kindergarten begins, even if your child has no vision problems. **Eye exams are free for children at this age.**

### PROPER VACCINATIONS KEEP YOU HEALTHY!

For their protection, children should get a **booster shot between the ages of 4 and 6.** During your visit, the nurse will also check for other missing vaccines.
